Labour Cost Index 4th guarter 2007

LABOUR COST INDEX ROSE BY 5.1% COMPARED TO THE FOURTH QUARTER 2006

In the 4th quarter of 2007 the Labour Cost Index (LCI), excluding public administration and working day adjusted, rose by 5.1%, compared to the same period of the previous year (2.1 percentage points upper than the change recorded in the 4th quarter of 2006).

The Labour Cost Index (LCI), excluding public administration and working day adjusted, reached 143.7 in the 4th quarter of 2007, corresponding to a variation of 5.1% compared to the 4th quarter of 2006, up from 3.0 % in the same quarter of the previous year.

1. ECONOMIC ACTIVITY

In the 4th guarter of 2007 the hourly labour costs grew in the majority of the economic activities. The highest increases were observed in "mining and quarrying" (+13.4%),"education" (+8.7%), "others activities" (+8.3%), "health work" and social (+8.0%),"construction" (+7.3%) "hotels and restaurants" (+7.1%), "manufacturing" (+7.0%) and "wholesale and retail trade" (+5.7%), which changes were largest than the LCI (+5.1%).


Compared with the same quarter of the previous year, the smallest increases were observed in "real estate, renting and business activities"(+4.4%) and "transport, storage and communication" (+1.2%).

Negative variations were registered in "electricity, gas and water supply" (-5.6%) and "financial intermediation" (-1.4%).

The rate of change in "mining and quarrying", "education", "others activities", "health and social work", "construction", "hotels and restaurants, "manufacturing" and "wholesale and retail trade" resulted from the combined effect of a year-on-year increase in average labour costs and a year-on-year decrease in hours actually worked, which led to an increase in the hourly labour costs.

The growth in the hourly labour costs (LCI) in "real estate, renting and business activities" and "transport, storage and communication" was due to a year-on-year decrease on hours actually worked higher than a year-on-year decrease in average labour costs.

The decrease in the hourly labour costs (LCI) in "electricity, gas and water supply" and "financial intermediation" was due to a year-on-year growth in hours actually worked higher than a year-on-year increase in average labour costs.


2. REGIONS NUTS II

Comparing with the same quarter of the previous year, the increase of the hourly labour costs was higher than the LCI variation (+5.1%) in Madeira (+10.1%), Açores (+6.7%), Norte (+6.6%), Lisboa (+6.2%) and Centro (+6.0%).

Algarve (+4.6%) and Alentejo (+3.5%) presented smallest increases.

The rise in the hourly labour costs in Madeira, Açores as well as in Norte, Lisboa, Centro and Algarve, were the result of the combined effect of a year-on-year growth in average labour costs and a year-on-year decrease in hours actually worked. Chart 2 – LCI by regions NUTSII in 4thQ 2007

The change observed in Alentejo was due to the year-on-year decrease in hours actually worked higher than the year-on-year decrease in average labour costs, which corresponded to an increase in the hourly labour costs (LCI).

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


3. OCCUPATIONAL GROUPS

In the 4th quarter of 2007, compared to the 4th quarter of 2006, among the occupational groups where the LCI rose, the largest increases were in "service workers, shop and market sales workers" (+13.3%), "craft and related workers" (+6.4%), "technicians and associate professionals" (+6.2%) and "clerks" (+5.9%), which rates of change were highest than the LCI (+5.1%).

Increases were smallest to the ones of the LCI (+5.1%) in "skilled agricultural and fishery workers" (+3.6%), "elementary occupations" (+3.4%), "professionals" (+3.3%) and "plant and machine operators and assemblers" (+0.4%).

"Legislators, senior officials and managers" (-0.8%) registered negative variations when compared to the

The rate of change for the occupational groups "service workers, shop and market sales workers", "craft and related workers", "technicians and associate professionals", "clerks", "skilled agricultural and fishery workers", "elementary occupations" and "professionals" was due to the combined effect of a year-on-year increase in average labour costs and a year-on-year decrease in hours actually worked.

The growth of hourly labour costs in "plant and machine operators and assemblers" was explained by a rise in average labour costs higher than the increase in hours actually worked.

The decrease in average hourly labour costs in "legislators, senior officials and managers" was justified by a year-on-year rise of hours actually worked higher than a year-on-year increase in average labour costs.

4. INTERNATIONAL COMPARISON

Chart 4 presents the year-on-year changes in the hourly labour costs, incurred by employers as a result of engaging the labour work force, relating to the last quarter available (3^{th} quarter of $2007^{(a)}$) for activities as a whole (C to K) published by Eurostat under the title "LCI – Labour Cost Index", on 13^{th} December 2007.

In the 3th quarter of 2007, labour costs published by Eurostat for the EU27 grew by 3.7% compared to the same quarter of the previous year. In Portugal, hourly labour costs rose by 3.6%.


Latvia (+30.0%), Romania (+23.2%), Estonia (+20.6%), Lithuania (+20.1%) and Bulgaria (+16.3%) registered the highest increases in the hourly labour costs that largely exceeded the year-on-year developments in the EU27 (+3.7%).

Increases were smallest to the ones of the EU27 (+3.7%)in Sweden (+2.5%), Austria (+2.5%), Greece (+2.5%), Finland (+1.9%) and Germany (+0.9%).

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TECHNICAL NOTE

The series based on the year 2000 was developed in compliance with EU statistical requirements, pursuant to Regulation No 450/2003 of the European Parliament and of the Council. For reasons related to the implementation of a different methodology, this new series is not comparable with the previous one (1995 series).

Published/released series are adjusted series (for working day) (WDA, Working Day Adjusted), as released by Eurostat, and unadjusted series (NSA, Not Seasonal Adjusted), by economic activity, by NUTS II region and by occupational group (International Standard Classification of Occupations 1994). Both series (WDA and NSA) are not seasonally adjusted.

NUTS II regions are based on the new region nomenclature (NUTS 2002).

The LCI is an indicator that measures the development of the average labour cost per worked hour (hourly labour costs). The changes in the employment, hours actually worked and prices levels affect the indices obtained during the observed periods.

- ✓ Overtime payment
- ✓ Payments and benefits in kind
- ✓ Payment for hours not worked
- ✓ Employer's social contributions
- ✓ Collectively agreed, contractual and voluntary social security contributions
- Other (including payments to employees leaving the enterprise)

* Excluding the following activities: "Public administration and defence services, compulsory social security services" (L); and the public part of the following activities: "Education" (M) and "Human health and social work services" (N).
