## How changed the families in Portugal?

In Portugal, the average size of households has decreased significantly over the last 50 years, namely from 3.8 persons per household in 1960, to 2.6 persons in 2011.

Living as a couple (with or without children) remains the predominant form of family organization (62\% of households in 1960 and $59 \%$ in 2011). Over the last 50 years, we have seen an increase of couples without children (from $15 \%$ in 1960 to $24 \%$ in 2011), of lone parents nucleus (from $6 \%$ in 1960 to $9 \%$ in 2011) and of the number of persons living alone (from $12 \%$ in 1960 to $20 \%$ in 2011) and the decrease of complex households (from $15 \%$ in 1960 to $9 \%$ in 2011).
