


Consumer Prices Index July 2018

CPI annual rate of change increased to 1.6%

The CPI annual rate moved from 1.5% in June to 1.6% in July 2018. The annual core inflation rate, which excludes energy and unprocessed food products components, was 1.0% (the same value as in the previous month).

The CPI monthly rate was -0.6% (0.1% in the previous month and -0.7% in July 2017), while the CPI 12-month average was 1.1% (the same value as in the previous month).

In July 2018, the Portuguese Harmonised Index of Consumer Prices (HICP) annual rate of change was 2.2% (2.0% in the previous month), 0.1 p.p. above the rate estimated by Eurostat for the Euro area (in June this difference was nil).



In July 2018, the annual inflation rate measured by the CPI was 1.6%, 0.1 p.p. above the rate of the previous month (see Fig. 1). When rounded to one decimal place, this figure coincides with the value provided in the flash estimate, which was released on July 31st (see table 3 for further details on the differences between estimated and final CPI figures on page 4 of this press release).

The annual core inflation rate, which excludes energy and unprocessed food products components, was 1.0% (the same value as in the previous month). The unprocessed food aggregate recorded an annual rate of 1.3% in July (1.2% in June) while energy presented an annual rate of 7.7% (7.5% in the previous month).

The largest upward pressures on the overall annual rate of change came from increases in the prices of *Transports* and *Restaurants and Hotels*, while downward pressure came from changes in the prices of *Clothing and Footwear*.




In July, the CPI monthly rate was -0.6% (0.1% in the previous month and -0.7% in July 2017). The main upward contribution to this result came from changes in the prices of *Transports* and *Restaurants and hotels*. Conversely, downward contributions were observed in the prices of *Clothing and Footwear*, mainly as a consequence of the usual July sales period.

The CPI 12-month average rate was 1.1% in July (the same value as in the previous month).

In July, the Portuguese HICP annual rate was 2.2% (2.0% in the previous month) while the monthly rate was -0.4% (nil in June and -0.6% in July 2017).

In June 2018, the annual rate of change of the Portuguese HICP was the same as in the Euro area. In July, the Portuguese HICP annual rate of change is estimated to be 0.1 p.p. above the Euro area rate.



The HICP 12-month average rate was 1.4% in July (0.1 p.p. above the previous month).

Housing Rents

In July, the annual change rate of the housing rents for the whole country was 2.1%. The highest increase was observed in the Lisboa region (2.7%), with all the other regions displaying positive rates of change.

For the same period, the monthly rate of change of the average value of rents per square meter for the whole country was 0.2% (the same value as in the previous month). The main increase was observed in the Algarve region (0.4%) and all the other regions presented positive rates.



Consumer Price Index

The Consumer Price Index (CPI) measures the change over time of the prices of a certain basket of goods and services bought by a "typical" consumer. The CPI has been designed to capture price changes and not to measure price levels.

The CPI is updated every year with the most recent information on prices and quantities. The 2018 CPI weighting structure and the sample of goods and services included in the basket are a result of the combination of three fundamental sources of information: results of the Portuguese National Accounts complemented with the Household Budget Survey and the Census for more detailed levels of expenditure. Administrative data is also used.

The CPI is compiled through the aggregation of seven regional price indexes and the goods and services included in the index are grouped according to the COICOP classification.

Monthly rate

The monthly rate is the change in the index of a certain month compared with the index of the previous month expressed as a percentage. Although up-to-date, this measure can be affected by seasonal and other effects.

Annual rate

The annual rate is the change in the index of a certain month compared with the index of the same month in the previous year expressed as a percentage. In the presence of a stable seasonal pattern, seasonal effects do not influence this measure.

12-month average rate

The 12-month average rate is the change in the average index of one year compared with the average index of the previous year expressed as a percentage. This moving average is less sensitive to transient changes in prices.

Core inflation index (all items CPI excluding unprocessed food and energy products)

The core inflation index is compiled by excluding the prices of unprocessed food and energy products from the all items CPI. The primary objective of this index is to capture the underlying inflation pressures in the economy.

Harmonised Index of Consumer Prices

The Harmonised Index of Consumer Prices (HICP) is compiled in each member state of the European Union for the purposes of inflation comparisons across EU countries, as required by the Treaty on European Union¹. This index plays an important role as a guideline for the achievement of the European System of Central Banks primary objective: price stability. In 1998, the European Central Bank adopted the HICP as "the most appropriate price measure" for its definition of price stability in the Euro area².

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The HICP is produced in each Member State following a harmonized methodology developed by experts in the field of price statistics, under the "Price Statistics Working Group" and related Task Forces. From the methodological point of view, there are no major differences between the HICP and CPI. However, the different scope of coverage leads to differences in the weighting structure, mainly in Restaurants and hotels. This is mostly an effect of the inclusion of non-residents expenditure ("tourists") in the HICP and the corresponding exclusion from the CPI.

Presentation of data and rounding rules

Since the release of the January 2013 CPI indices are published with base 100 in the year 2012.

Due to rounding procedures, those indices may not reproduce exactly the published rates of change. However, it should be noted that the published rates prevail.

In this press release the descriptive analysis is based on rounded values to one decimal.

Differences between estimated and final values

In table 3, some descriptive statistics are presented for the differences between the estimated and final values of the annual rate for the last 24 months. The table also includes the differences for the last three months, in p.p..
