


Consumer Price Index April 2019

CPI annual rate of change was 0.8%

The Consumer Price Index (CPI) annual rate was 0.8% in April 2019 (the same value as in March). The annual core inflation rate, which excludes energy and unprocessed food products, was 0.8% (0.7% in the previous month).

The CPI monthly rate was 0.6% (1.8% in the previous month and 0.7% in April 2018), while the CPI 12-month average rate was 1.0%, the same value as in the previous month.

In April 2019, the Portuguese Harmonised Index of Consumer Prices (HICP) annual rate was 0.9% (0.8% in the previous month), 0.8 percentage points (p.p.) below the figure estimated by Eurostat for the Euro area (in the previous month, this difference was 0.6 p.p.).



Consumer Price Index (base 100 = 2012)

In April 2019, the annual inflation rate was 0.8%, the same value as in March (see Fig. 1). When rounded to one decimal place, this figure coincides with the value provided in the flash estimate, which was released on April 30th (for further details on the differences between estimated and final CPI figures, see table 3 on page 4 of this press release).

The annual core inflation rate, which excludes energy and unprocessed food products, was 0.8% (0.7% in the previous month). The unprocessed food aggregate recorded an annual rate of 0.2% in April (2.0% in March) while energy presented an annual rate of 1.1% (1.3% in the previous month).

The largest downward contributions to the overall annual rate of change came from changes in the prices of *Clothing and footwear* and *Food and non-alcoholic beverages.* Conversely, the main upward contributions came from the price increases in *Transports, Miscellaneous goods and services* and *Restaurants and hotels.*



It should be highlighted that the increases in *Transports* and *Restaurants and hotels* were in part due to the impact of Easter in the prices of air travel and hotels. On the opposite side there was a negative contribution in *Transports* due the significant reduction in prices for public transport monthly passes (see more details in the end of this page).


In April 2019, the CPI monthly rate was 0.6% (1.8% in the previous month and 0.7% in April 2018). The main upward contribution was observed in *Restaurants and hotels*. Conversely, the major downward contribution to the monthly rate of change came from price changes in *Food and non-alcoholic beverages*.

The CPI 12-month average rate was 1.0% in April (same value as in the previous month).

Harmonised Index of Consumer Prices (base 100 = 2015)

In April, the Portuguese HICP annual rate was 0.9% (0.8% in the previous month) and the monthly rate was 1.0% (2.1% in March and 1.0% in April 2018).

In March 2019, the annual rate of change of the Portuguese HICP was 0.6 p.p. below the Euro area rate. This difference is estimated to have increased to 0.8 p.p. in April 2019.



The HICP 12-month average rate was 1.2% in April (1.1% in the previous month).

Housing Rents

In April, the annual change rate of the housing rents for the whole country was 3.1%, 0.1 p.p. higher than in the previous month. The highest increase was observed in the Lisboa region (3.9%), with all regions displaying positive rates of change.


For the same period, the monthly rate of change of the average value of rents per square meter for the whole country was 0.2% (0.3% in the previous month). The main increase was observed in the Lisboa region (0.4%) and all the other regions presented positive or nil rates.

Public transportation prices

In April, as a result of a public policy aimed at reducing transportation costs, prices for public transport monthly passes were reduced significantly. Data on monthly passes usage was used to estimate the actual price change for the population, resulting in a 21.3% decrease in price. Therefore, there was an impact of -0.136 p.p. on the total CPI.

Several regions have yet to introduce this change in tariffs, hence further price reductions are expected in the coming months. The additional impact will be limited, as the most relevant regions have already updated their prices.

Consumer Price Index - April 2019



The CPI is updated every year with the most recent information on prices and quantities. The 2019 CPI weighting structure and the sample of goods and services included in the basket are a result of the combination of three fundamental sources of information: results of the Portuguese National Accounts, complemented with the Household Budget Survey and the Census for more detailed levels of expenditure. Administrative data is also used.

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The CPI is compiled through the aggregation of seven regional price indexes and the goods and services included in the index are grouped according to the Classification of individual consumption by purpose (COICOP).

Monthly rate

Consumer Price Index

The monthly rate is the change in the index of a certain month compared with the index of the previous month expressed as a percentage. Although up-to-date, this measure can be affected by seasonal and other effects.

Annual rate

The annual rate is the change in the index of a certain month compared with the index of the same month in the previous year expressed as a percentage. In the presence of a stable seasonal pattern, seasonal effects do not influence this measure.

12-month average rate

The 12-month average rate is the change in the average index of one year compared with the average index of the previous year expressed as a percentage. This moving average is less sensitive to transient changes in prices.

Core inflation index (all items CPI excluding unprocessed food and energy products)

The core inflation index is compiled by excluding the prices of unprocessed food and energy products from the all items CPI. The primary objective of this index is to capture the underlying inflation pressures in the economy.

Harmonised Index of Consumer Prices

The Harmonised Index of Consumer Prices (HICP) is compiled in each member state of the European Union for the purposes of inflation comparisons across EU countries, as required by the Treaty on European Union¹. This index plays an important role as a guideline for the achievement of the European System of Central Banks primary objective: price stability. In 1998, the European Central Bank adopted the HICP as "the most appropriate price measure" for its definition of price stability in the Euro area².

The HICP is produced in each Member State following a harmonized methodology developed by experts in the field of price statistics, under the "Price Statistics Working Group" and related Task Forces. From the methodological point of view, there are no major differences between the HICP and CPI. However, the different scope of coverage leads to differences in the weighting structure, mainly in Restaurants and hotels. This is mostly an effect of the inclusion of non-residents expenditure ("tourists") in the HICP and the corresponding exclusion from the CPI.

Presentation of data and rounding rules

Since the release of the January 2013 CPI indices are published with base 100 in the year 2012.

Due to rounding procedures, those indices may not reproduce exactly the published rates of change. However, it should be noted that the published rates prevail.

In this press release the descriptive analysis is based on rounded values to one decimal.

Differences between estimated and final values

In table 3, some descriptive statistics are presented for the differences between the estimated and final values of the annual rate for the last 24 months. The table also includes the differences for the last three months, in p.p..
