# Extra Trade Statistics January to May 2007

## **EXPORTS INCREASE 16,9% AND IMPORTS GROW 0,9%**

From January to May 2007, the exports grow 16,9% and the imports 0,9%, giving rise to a decrease of 17,3% in the deficit of the Trade Balance.


From January to May 2007, the exports and the imports show positive growth rates, respectively 16,9% and 0,9%, appointing to a decrease in the trade balance deficit.


The imports rate of coverage by the exports increases from 53,3%, observed in the period of January to May 2006, to 61,8%.

Analysing the data without the Fuels and Lubricants in this period, the exports grow 24,3% and the imports grow 14,6% which shows the importance of these products in the Extra Trade and its impact over the Third Countries Trade Balance (a decrease of 17,3% when including the Fuels and Lubricants, turns

into a 50,9% decrease when they are excluded). Without the Fuels and Lubricants the rate of coverage equals 94,5%, which is 7,3 points above the reported for the homologous period in the previous year.

## **Broad Economic Categories**

By Broad Economic Categories we point out the growth rate of about 16% in the categories of Industrial Supplies, Machinery and other Capital Goods, and 17,1% registered in Food and Beverages imports.

The Fuels and Lubricants group show a decrease of 14% in this period.

Concerning the exports, we underline the increases of 44,7% in the Transports Equipment and Parts and Accessories and 41,7% in the Machinery and Other Capital Goods, while the Fuels and Lubricants decline 26,5%.

Concerning the monthly evolution, **the imports**, after a period of some stability growth (between March and September 2006), overcame some volatility until February 2007 and shows since then an upward trend reaching 11,6% in May.


On the other hand, **the exports** growth that was slowing down between March and November 2006, shows since then an erratic behaviour, with peaks about 30% in January and April 2007, making it difficult to define the exports trend.
