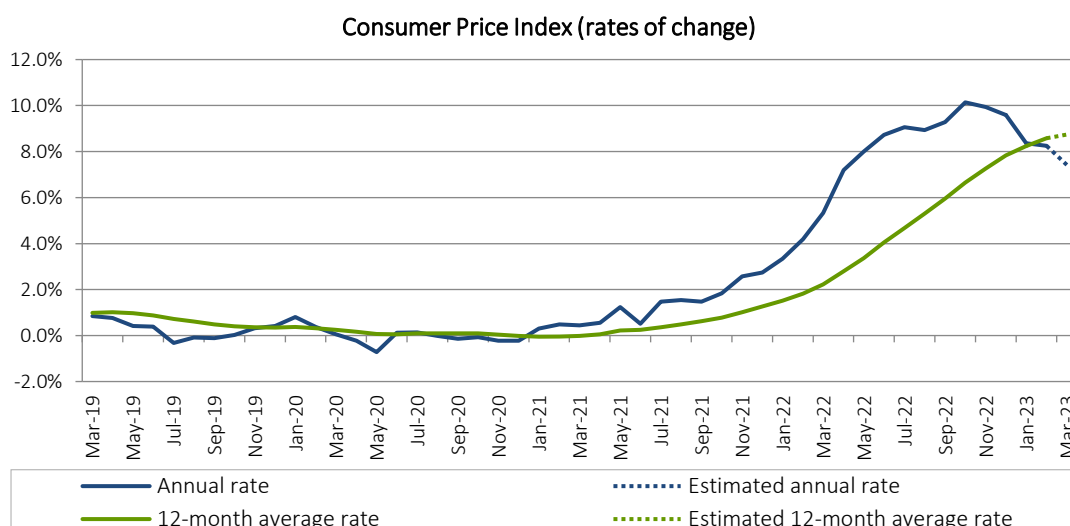
## CPI ANNUAL RATE OF CHANGE ESTIMATED AT 7.4%

Based on the information available until the date of the present press release, the Consumer Price Index (CPI) annual rate is estimated to have decreased to 7.4% in March 2023 (8.2% in February). This deceleration mainly reflects the base effect related to the price increases in fuels and food products, registered in March 2022. The core inflation index, which excludes energy and unprocessed food products components was 7.0% (7.2% in the previous month). The annual rate of change of the index for energy products is estimated to have decreased in March, moving from 1.9% in February to -4.4% and the estimated rate for unprocessed food is 19.3% (20.1% in the previous month).

The CPI monthly rate is estimated to be 1.7% (0.3% in February and 2.5% in March 2022), while the CPI 12-month average rate was estimated to be 8.7% (8.6% in the previous month).

The estimate of the Portuguese Harmonised Index of Consumer Prices (HICP) annual rate of change was 8.0% (8.6% in the previous month).

The March CPI final results will be released on April 13<sup>th</sup>, 2023.

## CONSUMER PRICE INDEX

The Consumer Price Index (CPI) measures the change over time of the prices of a certain basket of goods and services bought by a “typical” consumer. The CPI has been designed to capture price changes and not to measure price levels.

## CORE INFLATION INDEX (ALL ITEMS CPI EXCLUDING UNPROCESSED FOOD AND ENERGY PRODUCTS)

The core inflation index is compiled by excluding the prices of unprocessed food and energy products from the all items CPI. The primary objective of this index is to capture the underlying inflation pressures in the economy.

## PRESENTATION OF DATA AND ROUNDING RULES

Indices are published with base 100 in 2012 since the release of the January 2013 CPI.

Due to rounding procedures, those indices may not reproduce exactly the published rates of change. However, it should be noted that the published rates prevail.

In this press release the descriptive analysis is based on rounded values to one decimal.

## CPI/HICP FLASH ESTIMATE

Statistics Portugal publishes a CPI/HICP flash estimate based on provisional data and price estimates.

This publication presents estimates for the annual and monthly rates of change of those indices, following a long period of compilation and internal evaluation of their quality compared to the published final figures.
