

Jean-Luc Tavernier

Director General of INSEE

Alumnus of the Ecole Polytechnique and a graduate of the National School of Statistics and Economic Administration (ENSAE), Jean-Luc Tavernier has spent most of his career at the Ministry of Economy, Finances and Industry.

Ten years of this professional career was as head of forecasting at Bercy, the Ministry of the Economy (1985 – 1995). There he carried out several functions: to conduct studies on foreign trade, deputy head and head of economic projections and overall head of the office for economic policies. These 10 years enabled him to be enriched with a thorough working knowledge of Bercy.

After leading the ENSAE in 1995, he was appointed advisor to the Minister of Labor and Social affairs in charge of the corporate and financing law of the social security. From 1997 to 2001, Jean-Luc Tavernier was Assistant Director in charge of the forecasting department in charge of the public finances and the labor market.

Then he joined the INSEE in 2001 as Director of Studies and Economic Analysis. In 2002 he returned to the Ministry of the Economy as Director of forecasting, and between 2004 and 2005 to become Director of the Economic policy at the Treasury Department. He was then CEO of the Central Agency of Social Security, and equally Vice-President of the board of Orientation of Employment.

Jean-Luc Tavernier was appointed in June 2007, Head of the Minister's office at the French Ministry of Budget, after that in January 2010, as Deputy General Commissioner for Public Investment.

Since March 2012, he has joined again INSEE as Director General.
