



Born in 1950, in Leiria, Helena Cordeiro graduated in Economics from the Technical University of Lisbon in 1973 followed by post-graduation studies in project evaluation and planning, trade flows in small open economies. She joined the public administration in economic matters while teaching Economics at different universities in Lisbon; she also lectured at the Institute of National Administration.

Prior to joining the World Bank she held several positions in the Ministry of Finance and Ministry of Planning. She has also worked at the OECD Economics Department. While at the World Bank Group (WB) in Washington from 1985 to 2003 she held various positions namely country manager, senior economist and country economist, mainly in charge of Latin American and African economies. In 1993 she was appointed a Member of the

Executive Board of the World Bank Group (Alternate Director), while serving in different committees. She also represented Portugal in several international financial *fora* namely those aiming at replenishing mechanisms to ensure development and environment sustainability funding. She was appointed member of the Board of Statistics Portugal in November 2005.
